- Production

The improvement on living standards of Chinese people and hence the development of the feed industry in China attracted both the domestic manufacturers and the overseas manufacturers, as well as the illegal smugglers, to supply lysine to China.

- Import

In the past years, import lysine dominated the Chinese market. In 1999 the actual production from Chinese manufacturers is 13KT but the import lysine is near 40KT.

- Production Distribution in China

Guangdong is the largest feed producing province but the number of feed factories is much smaller compared to its large production. The reason is that Guangdong is a much more developed province and there are more large-scale intensive farms to provide meat and poultry for Guangdong. And because of its proximity to Hong Kong, it also exports large number of pig and chicken to Hong Kong. These farms are usually served by fewer but large capacity feed factories.
